Cecil Bullington, who was injured during the game was unable to walk. Mr. Knapp and others carried him on a stretcher onto the field where he was crowned lying down. The queen, Vicki Miller, was crowned by Cecil while he was lying on the stretcher.

The sudden news of the passing of Victor Danker, just five days after his father, Guy died, was received here. Apparently Victor died of a heart attack at the wheel of his vehicle before it hit a building in Denver.

EIGHTY YEARS AGO
OCTOBER 20, 1938
Mike Musser was a business visitor having accompanied a shipment of cattle there.

The garage at the Snyder residence was remodeled and made into a garage large enough for two cars. The building was being painted.

Twenty-seven calves belonging to the Whitewater Ranch were killed at the Nevens Station on the Union Pacific high line in Keith County. The calves broke from a corral and ran in front of a train. The calves were part of a big shipment to the Omaha markets. It is said the remaining 585 head brought the ranch nearly \$20,000.

Few duck hunters were noticed enroute to the lake country though the season opened. The drying up of many ponds and the low condition of the larger lakes keeps our country from being the hunter’s paradise it was a few years ago.

NINETY YEARS AGO
OCTOBER 18, 1928
A.G. Waits & Son received word that the boar “Lone Rider” which they sold to A.C. Stienbrink & Son of Netawaka, Kansas, was first junior yearling at the Topeka State Fair 1928 and 2nd at Kansas State Fair at Hutchinson.

The following is taken from the May 12, 1938 special McPherson County High School edition published in *The Tryon Graphic*.

Under a law which provided for Normal Training in High Schools, the McPherson County High School was organized.

When school was started in the fall of 1917, it was started under great difficulty and inconvenience. The first desks were tables, borrowed from the citizens of Tryon. The students gathered about these tables in straight-backed chairs. The first books were borrowed from the grade school which happened to have a few 9th grade books on hand. The first school was held in the upper story of the I.O.O.F. building. It was very cold and inconvenient with only one stove for heat in winter. Next, the school room was moved to the lower floor of the I.O.O.F. hall, having only two rooms. An assembly was held in one room, and a class room

Medigap/Medicare Supplement Policies Did You Know?

- ❖ You **MUST** have Medicare Part A and Part B
- ❖ You will pay the private company a monthly premium for your Medigap policy. You will pay this in addition to your Part B premium that is paid to Medicare.
- ❖ A Medigap policy covers only one person. If you and your spouse both want Medigap coverage, you'll each have to buy separate policies. However, many companies offer household discounts if you both have coverage with the same company.
- ❖ Medigap policies are standardized and are the same nationwide, except for MN, WI, and MA. Each company that sells them is regulated by federal and state laws designed to protect you, and they must be clearly identified as “Medicare Supplement Insurance.”
- ❖ Any standardized Medigap policy is guaranteed renewable even if you have health problems. This means that the insurance company can't cancel your policy as long as you pay the premiums.
- ❖ Medigap policies sold after 2006 can't include Prescription Drug coverage (Part D) so those policies must be purchased separately.

Medigap policies don't cover everything!
Most generally they do not cover long-term care, vision or dental care, or hearing aids. Coverage for these things is available separately.
