Eclipse committee winds up event

The 2017 Total Solar Eclipse on the Range committee met for the final time Wednesday evening, November 15, at the Veteran's Memorial Building to close out the books on a very successful Stapleton event.

Committee members met and held fund raisers for the past two years to invite, encourage, and promote bringing people to Logan County for the Eclipse. The August 2017 event drew around 6,000 people here and much needed revenue dollars were an added boost.

Gary and Liz Johnsen served as overall coordinators and clocked hundreds of volunteer hours working on the website, promoting Stapleton in numerous towns and venues, and helping with fundraising.

Final bills were paid and committee members voted to give the remaining funds to the Stapleton Community Foundation.

Eclipse proceeds previously disbursed went to the Stapleton Volunteer Fire Department - \$2,500; Friends of the Library - \$500; Stapleton School Foundation - \$2,500; Stapleton Chamber of Commerce - \$2,500; Village of Stapleton Park Fund - \$2,500; Stapleton Veterans - \$2,500; and the Logan County Ag Society - \$9,157.20 (proceeds from Eclipse event held at the fairgrounds and \$2,500 donation).

Rylee bagged a 6 x 8 muley southeast of Stapleton, Sunday, November 12.

Rifle deer season opened Saturday, November 11 and closed at sundown Sunday, November 19.

Dick Pipal of the Big Game Check Station in Stapleton, reported 51 deer were checked in on the first day at his station.

As of Friday afternoon, 193 had been taken and

three had been standouts.

Nebraska's modern deer season began in 1945, with a harvest of 275 mule deer and two white-tail deer from Nebraska National Forest near Halsey. Since then, deer hunting has become a treasured tradition enjoyed by countless hunters who have harvested more than two million deer. Season recommendations for 2017 by Nebraska Game & Parks allowed a harvest of approximately 10,000 mule deer and 56,000 whitetail deer.
