New fencing planned at
Loup Valley Cemetery

The membership of the Loup Valley Cemetery discussed repairing the fence surrounding the cemetery at their recent annual meeting

It was suggested replacing the fence with a continuous fence might be a better option.

According to records on hand, the existing fence was put in around 1948 when the cemetery was gifted additional land. At that time, wire was reused from the original fence that was put in around 1908. Estimates for a continuous fence were obtained from three contractors.

The Board of Trustees then met to discuss the bids. Repairing the fence was again discussed.

The board voted to replace the fence and give the cemetery an updated look. The bid from Dou-

ble M Welding for \$18,615.00 for a six-bar metal fence was accepted.

The cemetery association was able to take on this project because of generous donations and memorials given to the cemetery over the years.

The board is responsible for removing the old fence. Plans are being made to do this in June.

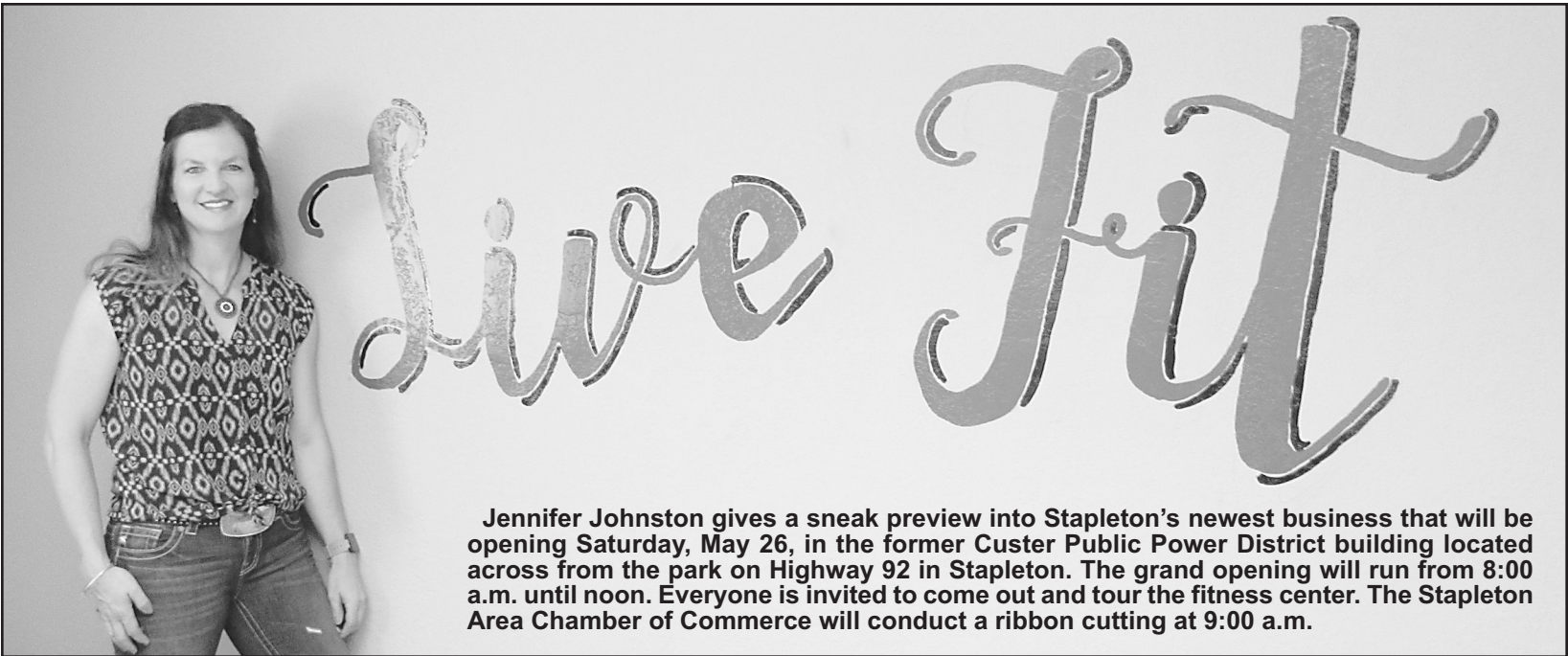
