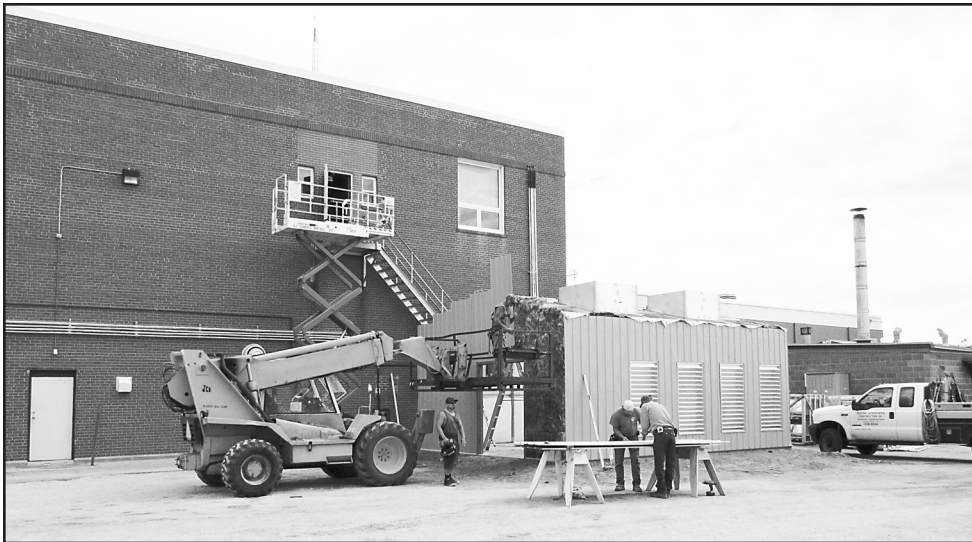

Robert Harvey is not a man of many words, but to students, faculty, and community members, he has been a constant,

steady force in the lives of those around him. "Harv" as he has affectionately been known, has taught over 1,000 students, including this year's underclassmen and junior high, as well as students who have moved before graduating.

A reception to honor him was held Sunday, May 21, at the Stapleton Community Center, where he was recognized by the community, and teaching staff, administration and board of education of Stapleton Public Schools.

How do you begin to tell the story of 52 years in a school system, a lifetime in one small village?

Apart from one year at McCook Junior College,

After graduating from Stapleton High School in 1961, and receiving his degree in 1965 from Kearney State College, he returned to Stapleton Schools in the fall of 1965 to begin his teaching career.

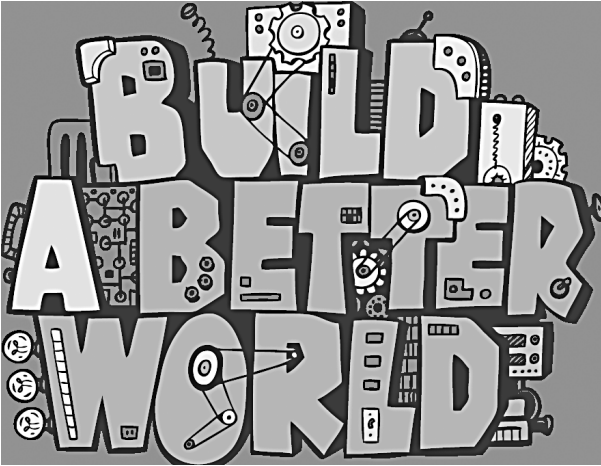
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Summer reading program now underway
