4-H Council receives \$1,600 improvement grant

The Logan County 4-H Council has received a \$1,600 “Working Here Fund” grant for 4-H equipment improvement. The grant is provided through Farm Credit Services of America’s (FCSAmerica) *Working Here Fund*. The Logan County 4-H Council will be making many improvements to the facilities and equipment used by 4-H’ers during the 4-H fair. Some improvements include panels for show ring and

pens, more electrical outlets in the show barn, and fans for the animals, along with a new public fashion show back drop. “These improvements will make the environment a safe place to show and prep their animals,” said Peggy Peterson, Logan County 4-H Council. “Improvements would also ease stress on the animals.” “At FCSAmerica, we value the op-

portunity to support the future of agriculture,” said Logan Thomeczek, regional vice president of retail operations at FCSAmerica’s North Platte office. The Logan County 4-H Council is one of 107 organizations to receive a *Working Here Fund* grant in the first quarter of 2017. FCSAmerica awarded \$179,000 during the latest grant cycle ending March 31, 2017.

Rodeo tickets will go off sale this year on August 11. No advance pork breakfast tickets will be sold. Advance rodeo tickets will be \$10.00 for adults

and \$4.00 for children. At the gate prices will be \$15.00 for adults and \$5.00 for children. Entrance to the Sunday Ranch Rodeo will be \$3.00 per person. Viewing of the 2017 Total Solar Eclipse on Monday, August 21, will be \$10.00 per person. Logan County Fair dates are August 17-20. Logan County 4-H events begin July 31 and run through August 4. 4-H events include: July 31 - Horse Show August 1 - 4-H Entry Day. August 2 - Clothing day, table toppers contest, small animal show, and public fashion show and food auction. August 4 - Large animal show and livestock auction.
