Commissioner districts redrawn after 2020 census

Some Logan County voters may be in a different commissioner's district as redistricting has been completed by Logan County Clerk, Debbie Myers. Due to the 2020 census, changes were necessitated to keep population the same in the three districts. Logan County has a total population of 716 people and a target of 239 people per district was targeted.

Clerk Myers said if you received a voter card in the mail from her office you are in a new district. Commissioner in District #1 is Lee Wonch and he is up for election this year. Other commissioners are District #2, Robert Doyle; and District #3, Scott Gaites.

Filing deadlines are rapidly approaching for the May 10 primary election. Incumbents have until February 10 to file and non-incumbents until March 1.

Filings received as of Friday, February 4 are:

County Treasurer: Richard Gewecke, Republican, incumbent.

County Clerk: Debbie Myers, Republican, incumbent.

School District R-1 Board of Education members up for election are Rich Burnside, Steve Schaeffer and Frank Kramer.

Burnside has filed.

Incumbent village board members have until July 15 to file and non-incumbents until August 1.

Those up for election

this year on the Village of Stapleton Board of Trustees are Dan Beckius and Amber Tatman. Village of Gandy Board of Trustees whose terms are up for election are Carla Wardrobe and Janice Buker.

The Logan County Commissioners discussed eliminating the commissioner districts and having commissioners elected at large at their January reorganizational meeting. Commissioners could vote to have it placed on a General Election ballot. More information will be obtained and discussed again at a later date.

Clerk Myers said all appointments have been made for 2022 except for a person from the community is still needed for the West Central District Health Board.

The annual salary for county clerk, county treasurer and county sheriff was set at \$48,460 and county commissioners, \$8,245.

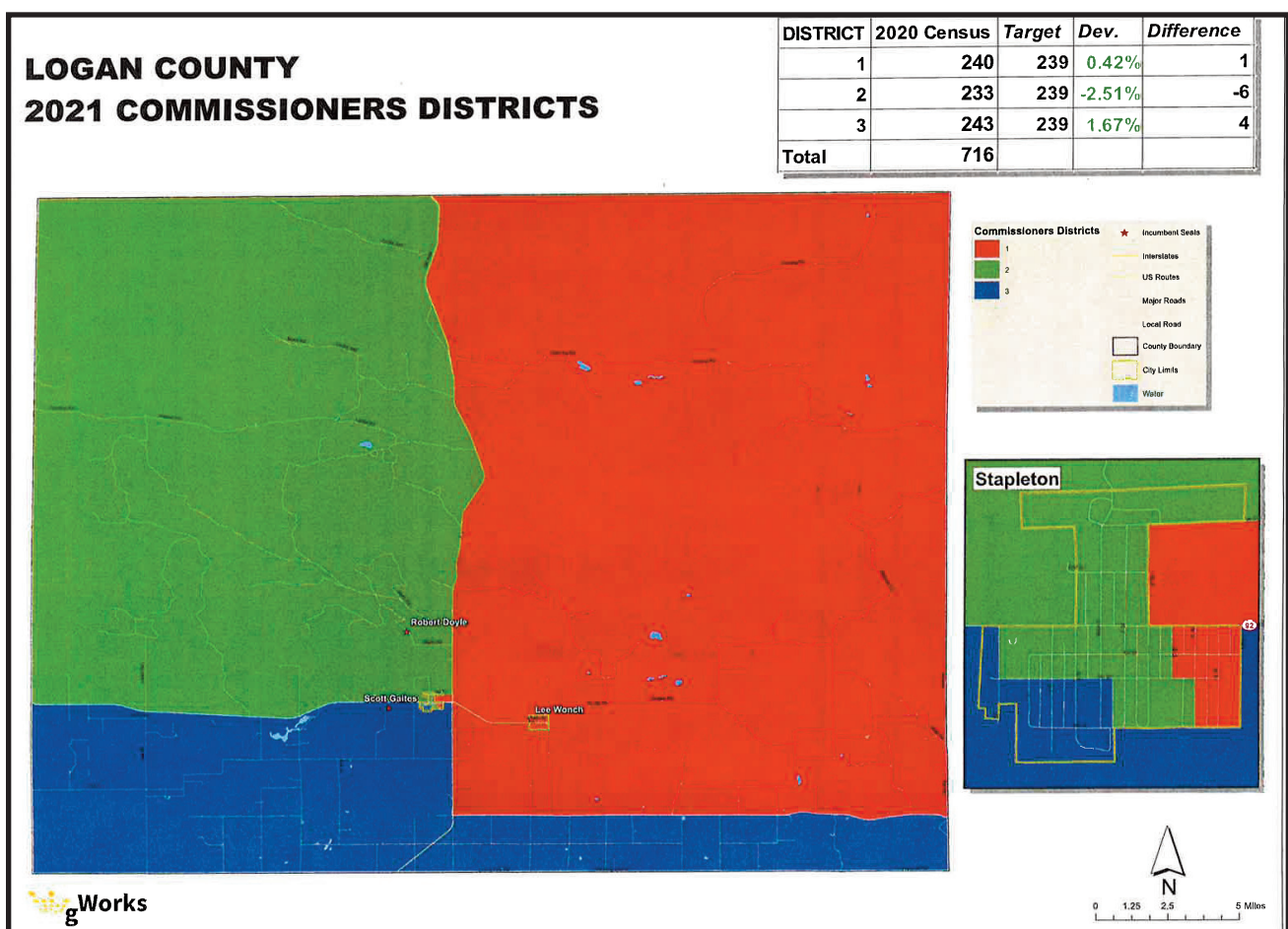
