ing the blood upon donation will be able to tell you your type and they'll issue you a blood donor card that you can keep.

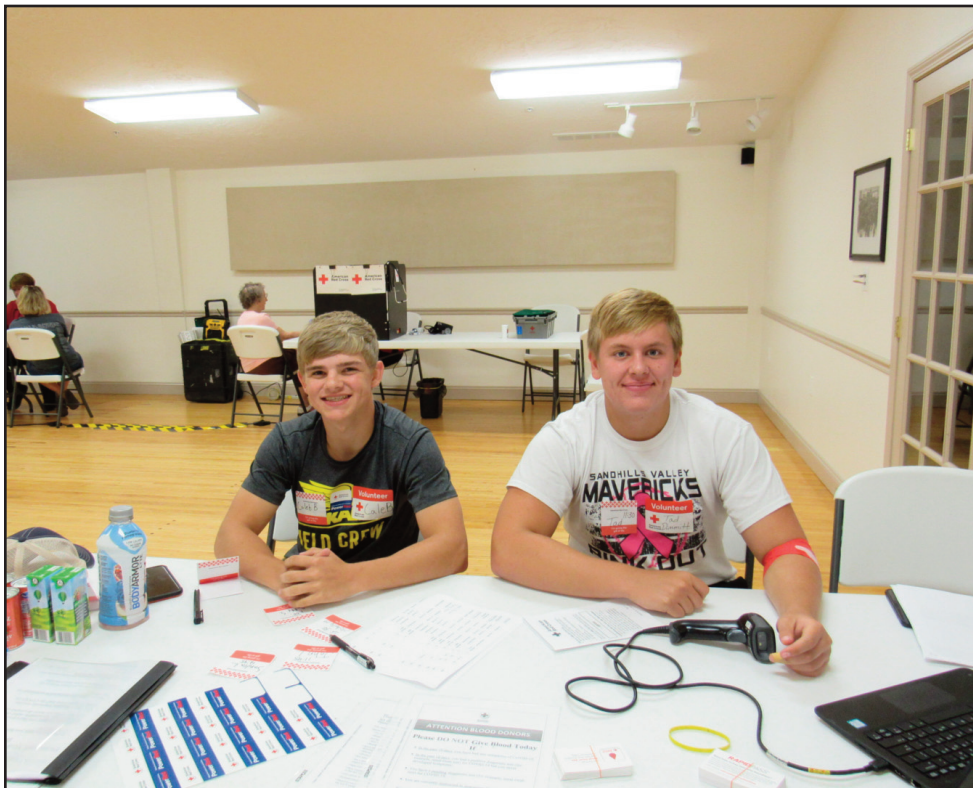

Football Field Project Completed

The Stapleton High School football field project is now complete, new sod has been rolled out and underground sprinklers have been installed. All bare areas have been seeded. Now it's just a matter of watering and waiting for cooler temperatures and some precipitation. Stapleton Public Schools Board of Education met for a regular meeting Monday, July 18, and the board is looking at sprinklers on the north and west side of the school building and the installation of sod on the north side of the school.

Superintendent Redinger said sod on the field is a sports mixture and the cost of the project was approximately \$79,460.00. The first home Maverick football game against Bayard on September 1 will now be played at McPherson County, and the Arapahoe game on October 16 will possibly be played in Stapleton.

The project was made possible through joint efforts of the Sprinkler Medic, Jorgenson Sod Farm, and Beveridge, Inc.

In other school board action:
